Equipment

Clothing – Clothing for the field should allow you to be safe outside all day (This will vary depending on location and time of year). Closed toe shoes are required. Be sure to include:

- Rain gear
- Warm layers
- Sun protection
- Appropriate footwear

Camping Gear - Meals are **not** included in the program students will need to provide their own camping equipment and food. Be sure to include:

- Flashlight or Headlamp (headlamp recommended)
- Food for overnight weekends (including lunches which can be taken into the field)

Survival Equipment

- Day pack for field excursions
- Stainless steel water bottle (**not insulated**)
- Quality Compass with a rotating bezel (I recommend the Suunto A-30 Field Compass on Amazon)
- Quality non-folding knife (We have some of the best survival knives you can buy for sale for \$20-\$80 if you don't already have a knife.)
- Lighter
- Camera (optional)
- Binoculars (optional)
- LifeStraw water filter (optional)
