ARRIVAL:

If you are camping on Friday night, feel free to arrive anytime after 4pm. The gate will be left unlocked for you. Please park in the parking area to the left.

PLEASE DRIVE SLOWLY ON GRAVEL ROADS:

We have neighbors who are very sensitive to vehicles traveling over the posted speeds (15mph for Bilbrook and 10mph for Woodview Ln). When people drive over 10-15mph, the roads get torn up, which causes friction with the neighbors and additional road repair costs.

RESTROOMS / WATER / OUTLETS:

There are restrooms and heated showers, **Prickly Pear**, available just across from the main parking area. There is a water bottle filling station across from the restrooms. Outlets are available for use at the **Osage** building or at the restrooms.

CAMPING AREAS:

Camping is casual at Earth Native. There are no "camp sites," rather areas where you can set up your tent. There will not be any staff on-site on Friday or Saturday evenings. See after hours info above.

Camping Area 1: The grassy area near the covered fire pit area, **CaraCara**, by the parking lot.
*Do not set up camp under the building.

Camping Area 2: Head down the hill in the woods past the **Pecan Bottom** area.

Camping Area 3: In the Game Field over by **Wild Life Forest Preschool**.

Camping Area 4: Near the **Mesquite** building in our North Campus.
*Do not set up camp under the building.

FIRES:

Feel free to make a fire in any of the fire pits. There is plenty of firewood to use over by the main parking area and firewood is included in your camping fee. (Check email for Burn Ban status.)

DRIVING AREAS

Vehicles are **ONLY** allowed in the parking lots and the loop to exit to the main parking area. Please do not drive down any other path or trail you see. These are for foot traffic only. You will need to carry your camping gear to your camping spot.

ALCOHOL POLICY:

No alcohol or controlled substances are allowed on campus.

Please **DO NOT** cut, break, or damage **ANY** standing trees or plants. This includes breaking branches off of trees, even if the branch itself appears dead. A lot of students use our campus every year, and even little impacts add up over time
